ANNUAL FRENCH CONTEST (2017)

Eligibility guidelines for HIGH SCHOOLS & Conditions for Participation:

Eligibility:

The best student in a high intermediate or advanced FRENCH class of any member of the Maison Française and/or any high school in Cuyahoga County or the areas immediately surrounding Cuyahoga County is eligible to participate.

1. Each school is entitled to sponsor ONE student..
2. In addition, each teacher-member of the Maison is also entitled to sponsor ONE student..
3. Total number of students per school: 4 (including one from school and one per each teacher/member)

Ineligibility:

1. Students from French speaking families and foreign exchange students are not eligible.
2. Any student who has won first prize in one of our previous contests is also ineligible.
3. More than one student sponsored only by the school.is not eligible.
4. More than one student sponsored by a teacher/member.is not eligible.

Additional:

1. Questions of eligibility must be resolved before the contest. (Please refer to the *GENERAL ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES*.)
2. Note – For teachers who have sponsored candidates before, please note that due to changing curricula and study abroad experiences, we no longer use “Catégorie A ou B” to distinguish among students.

Dates: Applications must be in our hands no later than Wednesday, March 29, 2017, or as early as possible.
Examination: Saturday, April 1, 2017 Starts at 9 am, by appt., and goes through morning and afternoon.

In the evenings during the week before the contest and up through Thursday before the contest, applicants will be contacted via telephone to set an appointment time for the examination. Calls are made in the order in which applications are received. Any applicant not contacted by Thursday evening, please call Dr. Martha Pereszlenyi-Pinter by phone, or contact via e-mail - see below.

Place: John Carroll University, O'Malley Center room 132

Parking: Free - use South Belvoir Blvd. Entrance. Stop at Guardhouse and request a *Visitor's Permit*.

This year, as we have done since 2012, the student candidate may have a choice for the prepared portion: 1) The student will prepare in advance a 2-3 minute oral presentation on any topic of interest to him or her (preferably on a French related topic and no notes allowed) OR 2) The student will prepare in advance a French or Francophone POEM of approximately 16-20 lines in length, and recite the poem from memory, for the judges (bring 3 photocopies of poem).

Following either choice 1 or choice 2, the judges will then ask questions and engage the student in impromptu conversation for the remainder of the time – approx. 10 minutes.

Each winner of a prize and the professor who recommended the winner are expected to attend the awards banquet as invited guests of the Maison Française. The presentation will be made:
