## ANNUAL FRENCH CONTEST (2019) Eligibility guidelines FOR COLLEGES-UNIVERSITIES:

### CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPATION:

- 1) The contest is open to FULL -TIME UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS from colleges and universities in Northeastern Ohio. Participants must be US citizens or permanent legal residents.
- 2) A college or a university in this geographic area may present TWO candidates.
- 3) In addition, a professor-member of the Maison Française in good standing may present -- as a privilege of membership -- ONE of his/her own students
- 4) However, a total of NO MORE THAN FOUR candidates may come from any one institution.  
N.B. For an explanation of categories and limits of eligibility, please refer to the **GENERAL ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES**.

The full range of prizes will be awarded only if a sufficient number of students participate.

The contest consists of two parts: 1) written and 2) oral

- 1) A 500-700 word ESSAY "en français"; hand written, no notes, electronic devices, or dictionaries permitted; a topic chosen from several suggested: Time Limit: 90 Minutes; during the essay writing period, candidates will meet one by one with the judges for their oral interview.
- 2) A ten minute ORAL EXAMINATION: a completely impromptu conversation initiated by one of the judges to determine the contestant's ability to handle French in an unanticipated situation. For the order of meeting with judges, candidates will draw numbers; those from a school outside of Cuyahoga county will be given the option to draw numbers from earlier times, to accommodate longer driving distances.
